Welcome

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

Amen.

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Dear friends in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world, Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his suffering, we may share his risen life.

Blessing of the Palm Crosses

Please hold up your palm cross for the blessing.

God our Saviour, whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as Messiah to suffer and to die, let these palms be for us signs of his victory; and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Let us go forth in peace, praising Jesus our Messiah, as did the crowds who welcomed him to Jerusalem.
