We all stand and turn to face the Deacon as the gospel is read.

A sentence from scripture is read to which we all respond:

Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the reading:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

The children return from their Easter egg hunt.

The Presentation of the Candidates for Baptism

Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome these candidates

and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

The president asks the candidates for baptism:

Do you wish to be baptised?

Candidates: I do.

Parents and godparents or sponsors are asked questions to which they respond:

The Church receives N with joy.

Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith.

Will you pray for them, draw them by your example into the community of faith and walk with them in the way of Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism *N* begins their journey in faith.

You speak for them today.

Will you care for them and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

The president addresses the Parents, Godparents and candidate for baptism:

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvelous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

I renounce evil.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?

I do.

Signing with the Cross

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of his cross.

When all the candidates have been signed, the president says:

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

**Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ
against sin, the world and the devil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

The children receiving their first communion are invited to stand and receive the sign of the cross.

Admission of Children to Communion

We are God's pilgrim people. We share in the story of God's love for the world.
God's love in Christ, calling us to himself,
God's love in the Spirit, giving strength for our journey of faith.
We celebrate this love in word and song,
we feed on Jesus in bread and wine and make him known through our life together.

Do you wish to receive communion from this day forward?

Candidates: I do.

As the people of God in this place, we share the responsibility of encouraging one another in our worship and supporting one another in our discipleship, by our example and our prayers.

We welcome you in Jesus' name to receive communion with us.

The candidates for First Communion are anointed.

Profession of Faith

The water in the font was blessed at our dawn service this morning.

Let us affirm together, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,
source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,
who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit,
who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

**We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

The president asks the candidates

N, is this your faith?

Candidates: This is my faith.

Baptism

N, I baptise you

in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Amen.

The children receiving first communion come to the font and mark themselves with the water of baptism.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you
and also with you.
Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president praises God for his mighty acts:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.**

The president recalls the Last Supper, and we use this acclamation:

Great is the mystery of faith.
**Christ has died,
Christ is risen,
Christ will come again.**

The prayer continues and ends with praise to God to which everyone responds:

Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Giving of Communion

The president says the invitation to communion:

If you do not, please come to the altar for a blessing, holding this book as a sign. Someone will indicate when to come up.
